#### Blueprint for EU Forest-based industries 2013

(Document: SWD (2013) 343)

- Accompanying "new EU Forest Strategy"
- Contributes to EU Industrial Policy
- Covers four industries:
  - 1. woodworking
  - 2. furniture
  - 3. pulp & paper manufacturing and converting
  - 4. printing
- Representing:
  - about 7% of EU manufacturing GDP
  - nearly 3.5 million jobs

# Blueprint: Scope



#### **Challenges: for which remedial initiatives:**

- stimulating growth
- resource and energy efficiency
- raw materials sources and flows
- logistics (wood harvesting, infrastructures & transport)
- structural adaptation
- innovation; research & development
- education, training & skills; ageing workforce
- Coherence & costs of EU legislation
- EU climate policy from 2030
- international competition, trade & co-operation
- Information, communication & image











### Sectoral restructuring - the long view

**1990s**: European pulp & paper industries restructured, largely by mergers and acqusitions (time of « endless growth », driven by domestic and overseas demands

**2010s**: despite continued growth for hygienic & packaging grades, less printed media means decline for many printing & writing papers. Europe 2050 goals (e.g. reduce energy consumption and carbon footprints) drive innovation towards the bio-economy: wood-based bio-refineries producing an array of pulps, bio-fuels, bio-chemicals, bio-medicines, bio-textiles, etc.

NB printing industry: anticipated restructuring, with full involvement of social partners.



### Sectoral restructuring - the long view

**Woodworking industries (WWI):** with few exceptions (e.g. wood-based panels, large sawmills), the WWI has not consolidated much.

- « Indufor study (2013)» demonstrated that WWI face:
- highest global roundwood costs
- highest global energy costs (X 2.5 those of USA)
- highest global labour costs
- low-cost international competition, esp. from Asia

But has survived through quality, innovation and high labour productivity, though with decreasing profitability

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# <u>Sectoral restructuring – the long view</u> Sub-sectoral trends in global markets:

sawmilling: further consolidation of big firms; for SMEs and micros: specialise +/- innovate, shrink or die wood-based panels: EU capacity moving east for cheaper: wood, energy & labour but also new markets wooden packaging: growth through offering cmplete service to global value chains; efficient logistics wooden construction: engineered wood products (EWP), e.g. I-beams, glulams, etc. have offered stable and predictable performance for frames & components. Cross-laminated timber (CLT) panels: clean, cheaper, quick, multi-storey building via pre-fabrication off-site.



### How to restructure amidst policy changes?

- 2013:- new EU finance period 2014-20; reduced budget
  - implementation of EU Timber Regulation
  - new EU Forest Strategy and F-BI Blueprint
  - Industrial Policy (IP) communication: including « reindustrialisation » increase manufacturing share of EU GDP
  - RTD & innovation: Horizon 2020; COSME
- 2014:- Industrial Policy (IP) communication
  - 2030+ Climate & Energy goals, e.g. 27 % RES revision of « Carbon-leakage List »
  - Biomass Report: status quo till 2020



### How to restructure amidst policy changes?

- 2014:- new European Parliament; new Commission:
  - 10 priorities, including growth and jobs
  - Green Economy?
  - 300 Bn € EU Investment Package
     (European Fund for Strategic Investments)
  - Industrial Policy: news January 2015; but will prioritise:
    - facilitating access to inputs for EU firms
    - improving access to markets
    - fostering innovation
    - a business-friendly environment, esp. for SMEs
- 2015: Commission Work Programme includes « smart & clean industry » (ICT + high technology for high productivity of customer-focused, value-added products and services)
  - EU Timber Regulation Review; Paris Climate Conference



### Implementing the Forest-based industries Blueprint

- 2013-14:- study on customer information for furniture
  - European Innovation Partnership on Materials, including wood: call for commitments, e.g. wood mobilisation
  - set up EU Expert Group on Forest-based Industries
  - Standing Forestry Committee Working Group on criteria & indicators for sustainable forest management
- 2015: study on cascading use of wood
  - study: cumulative cost assessment (CCA) of the impacts of EU legislation & policies on the forest-based industries
  - focused sub-groups of the F-BI Expert Group?
  - EU Timber Regulation review NB links with CCA
- study: good practices in resource & energy efficiencies in the EU F-BI, esp. woodworking and SMEs & micro firms



# New Expert Group on Forest-based Industries and Sectorally Related Issues - 1:

"F-BI" Expert Group's membership (24 + (max) 28):

- 4 members: woodworking industries
- 2 members: furniture industries
- 4 members: pulp, paper & board manufacturing and converting industries, and printing industries
- 14 members: other organisations having specific knowledge of, expertise in and responsibilities for sectorally related issues, including at least: forest management; social dialogue; publishing; bioenergy; research & innovation and environmental matters
- 28 (max.) Member States (one member each)

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# New Expert Group on Forest-based Industries and Sectorally Related Issues - 2:

#### Tasks of the New Expert Group:

- a) at the request of the Commission or on its own initiative, to provide the Commission with legal, economic and technical advice on the forest-based industries and sectorally related issues, in particular in relation to the preparation and implementation of Union policy and legislation;
- b) to establish co-operation between sectoral and Member State bodies and the Commission on questions relating to the forest-based industries and sectorally related issues;



- c) to assist the Commission in monitoring the development of policy and activities in the field of forest-based industries and sectorally related issues;
- d) to bring about an exchange of experience and good practice in the field of the forest-based industries and sectorally related issues.

Member States, forest-based industries and other sectorally relevant bodies have been invited to appoint one representative plus one alternate (back-up) each. A list of members and representatives will be published in the Commission's Expert Group Register.

### F-BI Expert Group plenary meeting 21/11/2014:

Presented detailed draft work programme for 2014-16 to further implement F-BI Blueprint

Remedial activities categorised by actors (EU, F-BI, MS) for reporting on progress and indicating future intentions, e.g. within national sectoral strategies:

## **EU/EC** (in addition to those already mentioned):

- trade agreements: market access for exports
- sustainability criteria over whole life cycle
- better information on wood supply: JRC study
- facilitate access to RTD funding for SMEs



#### **Forest-based Industries:**

- follow up communications on sustainable building
- value-chain co-operation for sustainable wood supply
- identify needs and provisions for education, training and skills development in F-BI (NB Social Dialogues)
- raise awareness, knowledge & visibility of sub-sectoral issues affecting image along whole value chains

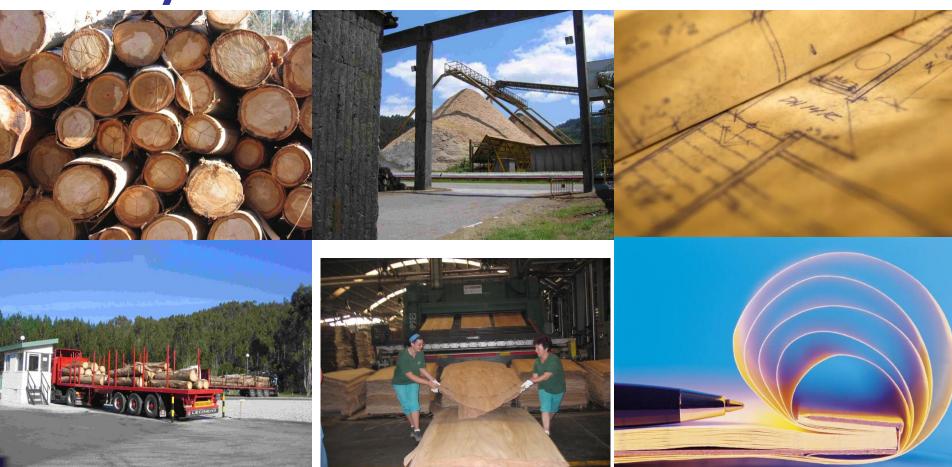
#### **Member States:**

- develop: forest & other infrastructures
- training and finance for more wood harvesting
- stimulating favourable conditions for construction
- recover & recycle more wood products and residues
- facilitate restucturing of F-BI sub-sectors
- promote forest-based sector innovation
